4. What are you to be seeking and not seeking? (1 Cor. 10:24; 13:5)
5. How do you know that you are seeking your own interests? (Phil. 2:4-5, 21)
6. Who is this neighbor? (1 Cor. 10:24)
7. How do you apply 1 Cor. 10:25 to present situations?
8. What kinds of implications should the thought that everything in the earth is the Lords create? (1 Cor. 10:26; Deu. 10:14)
9. How would you apply the scenario of 1 Cor. 10: 27 to other areas of freedom?
10. How do you possibly apply the second scenario to areas within lawful choices? (1 Cor. 10:28-29a)
11. What is the meaning of conscience? How does the conscience affect your decisions? (1 Cor. 10:27-29a)
12. Why are your freedoms determined by another’s conscience? Does that seem unfair? (1 Cor. 10:29b)
13. Why do I have to change, even though I can give thanks for my freedom, just because someone speaks evil about it? Why does this seem unfair? Why would this rub someone the wrong way? (1 Cor. 10:30)
14. How does 1 Cor. 10:31 settle the question of 10:29b and 10:30?
15. Why must you do everything for the glory of God? (1 Cor. 10:31)
16. How does 1 Cor. 10:31 answer the question of profitable choices?
17. How do you know you are doing things for the glory of the Lord? (1 Cor. 10:23-31; Col. 3:23; Col. 3:17)
18. How does the glory of God shape your usage of spiritual gifts? (1 Peter 4:11)
19. What is the meaning of “give no offense?” (1 Cor. 10:31; Phil. 1:10)
20. What 3 groups should concern us when deciding for the glory of God? (1 Cor. 10:32)
21. How did Paul say he operated his life? (Acts 24:16)
22. How does one live pleasing verses for personal profit? (1 Cor. 10:33)
23. How did Jesus not please Himself? (Rom. 15:2-3)
24. What is the different between pleasing of men in Gal. 1:10 and 1 Cor. 10:33?
