4. What does it mean practically if Jesus is the Lord of my life?
5. How does my confession of Jesus as Lord relate to my actions? Luke 6:46
6. Do my words of calling Jesus lord guarantee my eternal destiny? Matt. 7:21-23
7. How was Jesus made Lord when He was already Lord in character? (Acts 2:36)
8. What does it mean that Jesus was made Lord and Christ in Acts 2:36?
9. What does Col. 1:15-18 imply about Christ being God?
10. Does your profession of Jesus as Lord, match with you living under His lordship?
11. Why should you commit yourself to the Lordship of Christ?
12. Who is eternal life through? (Rom. 6:23)
13. How all encompassing is your dependency to Christ Jesus? (John 15:5)
14. How is the commitment to Lordship related to His character and actions?

20. What is your standard for measuring the truth? And how does that relate to what 1 Cor 1:17-31 says?
21. What very important lesson will God teach you even to the point of letting you go hungry? (Deu 8:3)
22. What is the important command given to the messengers of God to give to the people of God? (2 Tim. 4:2)
23. By what reference point do you solve you problems, God's word or human wisdom?
24. Examine your last major decision, what verses of scriptures did you relate to solve that matter?
25. What kind of wisdom did God promise to destroy? (1Cor 1:19)
26. Why should we rely on Scripture and not man's ideas? (Jer. 23:28-32)
27. Notice the contrast between what God is doing with human wisdom in 1 Cor. 3:19-20 and what is profitable for men in 2 Tim. 3:16-17?
