3. What were the 2 evils that the people committed in Jer. 2:13?
4. How does Jer. 2:13 relate to people departing from God?
5. How do you set up an idol in your heart? How would you know that you have done this? (Eze. 14:3-7)
6. Contrast the two ways of determining your code of conduct from Gal. 2:20; and Deu. 12:8? Which one would best describe your present way of living?
7. Read 2 Cor. 11:3. What does the serpent (who is Satan) want to lead you away from most? How should you avoid this deception of Satan?
8. Contrast the difference between the proud person and righteous person in Habakkuk 2:4?
9. How do you detect that you are leaning on your own understanding? (Pro. 3:5-7)
10. How does Heb. 3:12,13 describe why we fall away?
11. How does Heb. 3:13 instruct us to prevent this falling away?
12. What does it mean to start in the Spirit and be perfected in the flesh? (Gal. 3:3)
13. In Acts 8:18-21 what was the source of why Simon's heart was not right?
14. How can I detect what I am enslaved to? (Rom. 6:16)
15. How did God discipline the children of Israel in Judges 2:13,14 and 6:1,2?
16. What are some forms of discipline spoken about in 2 Chr. 7:13,14?
17. Can you distinguish between the negative correction of God and the positive work of a trial?
18. How is discipline explained in Job 33:19-21?
19. Would Satan ever be used to discipline a Christian? (1 Cor. 5:5)
20. How did God discipline the people in Isa. 57:17?
21. Will God ever discipline you by giving you what you want? (Ps. 106:15)
22. Why was the Church in Rev. 2:4,5 disciplined and what form did it take?
23. What two ways could the Laodiceans respond to the verbal warning. What warning of disciplined was stated? (Rev. 3:15,16)
24. Does God discipline us because He hates us, loves us or just does not care?(Rev. 3:15; Heb. 12:7-11)
25. What are the reasons or purposes recorded in Heb. 12:7-11 for God's discipline?
26. Are you presently under God's discipline and if you are, what are you going to do about it today to get out from underneath it?
27. If a Christian can't avoid judgment in the form of discipline then what degree of punishment will the non-Christian receive if they don't repent? (1 Peter 4:17; 2 Thes. 1:7-9)
