3. What goes with the confession of sin mentioned in Psa. 38:18?
4. How were they to prevent the sin from becoming a stumbling block? (Eze. 18:30-31)
5. What do your actions show about your direction in life? Where are you at?
6. Why did the king tear his clothes? (2 Chr. 34:18-19)
7. Read 2 Chr. 34:21-34 to answer the following question.
8. What was God going to bring upon that place? (v. 24)
9. Why was this wrath coming? (v. 25)
10. What was the king's response that God noted as significant? (v. 27)
11. How does this teach us to respond to God's correction? (v. 27-31)
12. What characterized their response to God's verbal correction? (Jer. 8:6-8)
13. How would you describe the reaction of the people to God's discipline? (Jer. 5:3)
14. In what two ways does this verse describe the things that hinder us from running the race of the Christian life? (Heb. 12:1)
15. What might hinder your walk with God?
16. What kind of decisions do you need to make to get on track and stay on track? (Heb. 12:1)
17. How did David deal properly with his sins? (Psa. 32:5)
18. Can a person confess their sins without having a real desire to change? How? (Ex.10:16-17)
19. What problems do you see in Saul's admission of his sin to Samuel? (1 Sam. 15:24-30)
20. Even though they were doing the right things, why did God have a problem with them? What was missing? (Mal. 1:6-8) Is that same thing missing from your service?
21. Did Judas feel a sense of desperation about his sin? (Matt. 27:3-5)
22. Did Judas admit that he sinned? (Matt. 27:3-5)
23. What do you think was missing from Judas' response, which revealed that his sadness was not sufficient before God?
24. If you confess your sins correctly what will God do? (1 John 1:9)
25. If you confess your sins does that mean that there will be no consequences or discipline for your sins? (Josh. 7:19-25)
26. When you confess your sin does it mean that you admit you deserve any necessary correction that the Lord might bring?
27. What is the difference between how the elders responded in 1 Sam. 4:3 to get the deliverance and how Samuel said they should do in 1 Sam. 7:3-4 to be delivered from their enemies?
28. What decision did the people need to make to prevent further correction? (Rev. 3:1-3)
